INFRASTRUCTURES OF JUSTICE -- POLI 134 (Scripps College) -- taught by Professor Nancy Neiman. This research seminar focuses on the question: Do markets result in just outcomes? The underlying premise is that markets are deeply embedded in societal structures that tend to perpetuate underlying social conditions. The course explores the unjust infrastructures that markets tend to exacerbate, including racism, patriarchy, and land and asset distribution derived from historical colonial and slave plantation systems. COMMUNITY OF PRACTICE – ORST 173 (Pitzer College) – taught by Professor Barbara Junisbai. Being human together is inescapable. We must collaborate to achieve shared goals and to be part of something bigger than ourselves. But being human together is also messy, sometimes frustrating, sometimes harmful. This course considers evidence-based tools that foster self-awareness, compassionate communication, and healthy partnerships, then experiments with practices that help us reconnect.
